Notice of Construction

- Edgewood Drive: Woodsboro Drive to Crooks Road
- Woodsboro Drive: Edgewood Drive to Marywood Drive
- Ravana Avenue: Woodward Avenue to Hampton Boulevard
- Park Avenue: Maxwell Avenue to N. Maple Avenue
- Windemere Avenue: N. Blair Avenue to Campbell Road
- Vinsetta Avenue: Marywood Avenue to N. Main Street
- Durham Road: 13 Mile Road to Normandy Road

The above listed streets are scheduled to receive new sewer and/or water main under 2016 Sewer and Water Main Improvements Contract CAP1606. Construction is to begin the **week of April 11, 2016** at the earliest. The contractor awarded this work is Pamar Enterprises, Inc. of New Haven, Michigan.

The work along the above mentioned streets will consist of, but not be limited to: installation of new storm sewer and combined sewer, installation of water main, water and sewer service connections, removal and replacement sidewalk ramps, sidewalk, driveway approaches, curbing, asphalt pavement and concrete pavement. The anticipated completion date including restoration for this contract is mid November 2016.

During construction, there will be lane restrictions to allow for construction equipment. "No Parking-Tow Away Zone 7:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m." signs will be posted 12 hours in advance where required to allow for various construction operations.

Limited street access to properties and driveways will occur during utility installation and pavement replacement. Some driveway approaches will be removed and replaced as part of this project. Where this occurs, a temporary stoned driveway approach will be placed the same day as removal to provide driveway access until permanent paving operations begin.

Affected residents will be notified 24-hours in advance via door hanger when paving begins. The use of the driveway approach will be unavailable for up to 10 days to allow for forming, concrete installation and curing of the new concrete. **Please DO NOT move barricades or drive on new concrete until the barricades are removed by the contractor. Property owners who remove barricades and drive on the concrete will be billed for the cost to repair damaged concrete.**

Landscaping: Only where lawn areas have been damaged by the contractor's operations, the disturbed areas will be replaced with topsoil and sod. **Restoration of the lawn areas disturbed by the construction will begin after Labor Day.** The city does not replace special landscaping, brick, timbers, plantings or shrubs placed on city's property or within the public utility easements. The contractor will make every effort to avoid damage to any specialty landscaping.

Private Sprinkler Systems: Systems that are located in the public right of way must have the sprinkler heads and lines **marked by the homeowner by April 11, 2016 prior to the start of construction.** Sprinkler systems that are not marked at the time of construction and are damaged during the construction **will not** be repaired by the city contractor. The repair or replacement of damaged unmarked sprinkler system shall be the responsibility of the property owner.

Trash Pickup: There will be no change in the trash pickup dates and the trash will be taken care of as usual during the construction operations unless otherwise notified by the city.

The city realizes that this construction will be an inconvenience and all efforts to expedite this work will be utilized to minimize traffic conflicts and access to the various properties abutting the project.
