

Coalition organizational accomplishments:

- Awarded the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration community Drug Free Support matching five-year grant

- Assembled a full Executive Board
- Created new Board of Directors
- Increased staff positions to include: Youth Director, Fund Developer, Evaluator and Clerical Assistant


Events—Initiatives—Campaigns:

Coalition accomplishments are a result of community efforts. By involving sectors of the community, we achieve positive, measurable and sustainable change in the area of alcohol, tobacco, and drug abuse prevention.

- Hosted “Keeping the Door Open”, a parent/teen dialogue night focused on assessing high-risk situations and how to say no and keep your friends
- With our Police Department made face-to-face visits to our alcohol and tobacco retailers to distribute the ID checking guides and tobacco retailer education kits
- Participated in county-wide prevention programs, with “Parents Who Host Lose the Most...” campaign to reduce teen drinking
- Joined efforts to help support a safe prom and graduation
- Partnered with PTSA to support Spring break activities
- Youth Action Squad received authorization as an official youth club
- Assisted City of Royal Oak in recruiting teens to join city boards and committees
- Sponsored Alcohol Screening Day
- Coordinated patient-focused tobacco education program for local dentist with U of D Mercy
- Hosted “Meet and Greet” Opportunity of Youth Servicing/Helping Agencies
- Held “Talk Early, Talk Often,” a communication building workshop for parents
- Partnered with the National Children of Alcoholic


Association clergy-based program: “Support Families and Promoting Recovery”

- Collaborated with Royal Oak Schools to provide “Student Profile of Behaviors and Attitude Survey.” Made nine power point presentations on the results, two aired on cable
- Disseminated prevention information by: community mailings - Career Expo - local newspaper coverage - cable bulletin board messages - kindergarten welcome packets - and over 25 school/community group presentations
- Worked in partnership with Kimball High School students to create and help assemble table-top display boards on prevention themes
