The outcomes of highlighted goals in this report demonstrate our continued focus to increase access and participation in arts and culture in Royal Oak



GOAL: INCREASE THE **VALUE** OF ARTS AND CULTURE

Over the past year, the CFA continued and grew the widely successful Art Explored program. This year's program elected to extend the pieces selected in 2016 as well as add three new pieces. Art installed for this program was installed throughout Royal Oak' downtown. Creating a sense of visual beauty and place in areas such as near parking garages and street corners.

The Summer Concert Series returned to the Center Street Pop-Up Park for 2017. For six weeks visitors were able to enjoy free live music from a variety of acts. For example, attendees were able to enjoy the soul of Theo "Gridiron" Spight and Friends, and children and families were able to enjoy Miss Paula and the Candy Bandits.

The CFA continued its support of the Celebration for the Arts and awarded the annual community arts award to Susan Wedley for her continued dedication and support for art in Royal Oak.



GOAL: INCREASE THE **COLLABORATION** AMONGST VARIOUS LOCAL AND REGIONAL ORGANIZATIONS

In 2017, the CFA expanded collaborations with a variety of regional organizations to help promote art and culture in Royal Oak.

In 2017, the CFA partnered with the Royal Oak Restaurant Association to expand the offerings at the annual Summer Concert Series. Each week during the summer concerts, local restaurants offered selections from their menu for patrons to enjoy.

Pairing with the grand opening of the Royal Oak Public Library's Sunday hours, the CFA collaborated with the Detroit Institute of Arts to produce a piano stroll featuring the public pianos from the 2017 Public Piano Project.



GOAL: BECOME **ADVOCATES** AND **LEADERS** FOR ART AND CULTURE

In 2017, the CFA continued to expand their advisory role within the city commission. Chair Jason Gittinger, provided updates to the city commission on art happenings during public comment portions of meetings and a number of public art projects were presented to the commission for approval.

Also during this past year, the CFA expanded their advisory role to the city commission through changes to the city's sign ordinance. Advocating for an exemption to the sign ordinance for public art, the CFA has helped to formalize a role in fostering and encouraging private art installations and murals in the city. Two new murals, one at the River Rouge Brewery and the other at The Morrie, were approved by the city commission because of this process.
