Drivers' Ed

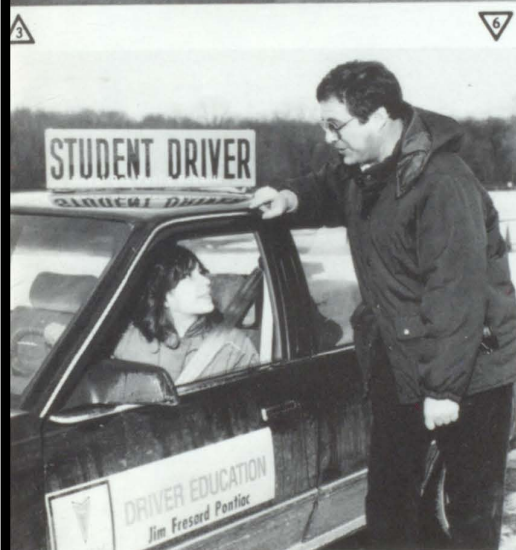

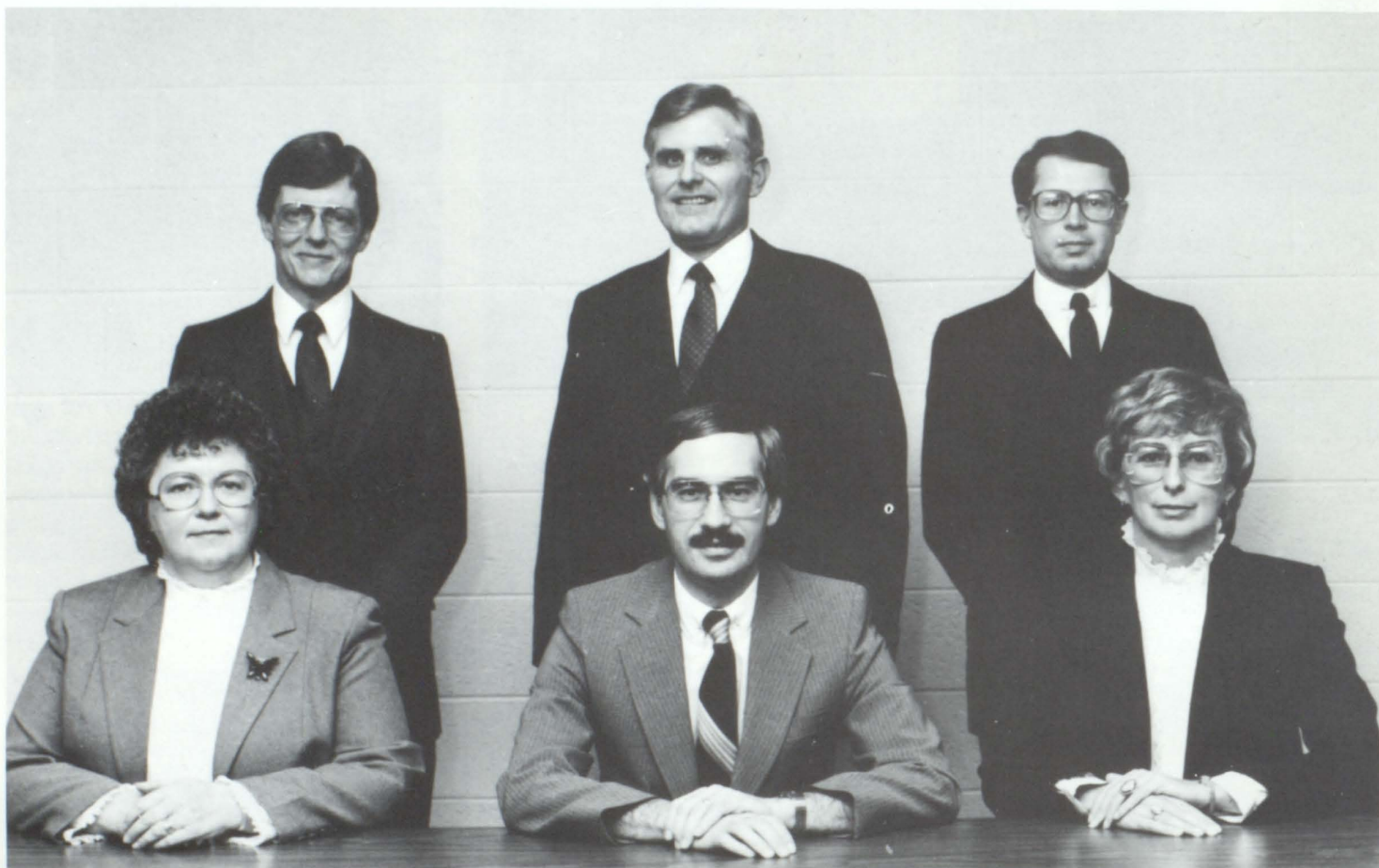

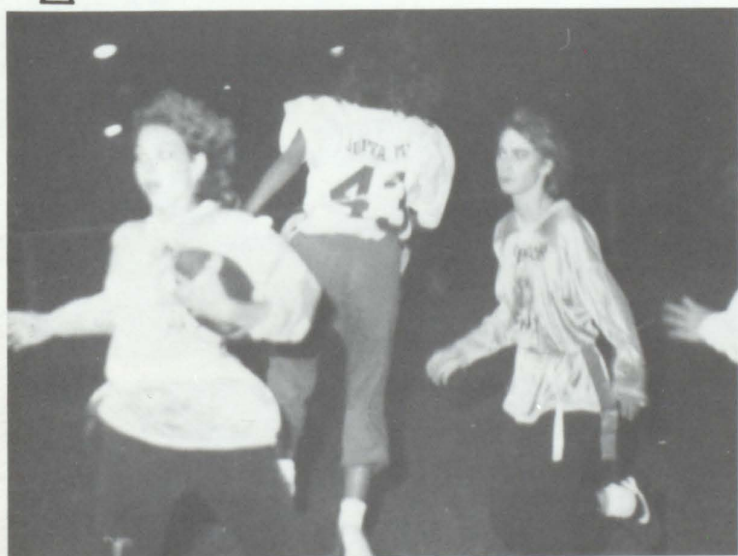


Powderpuff

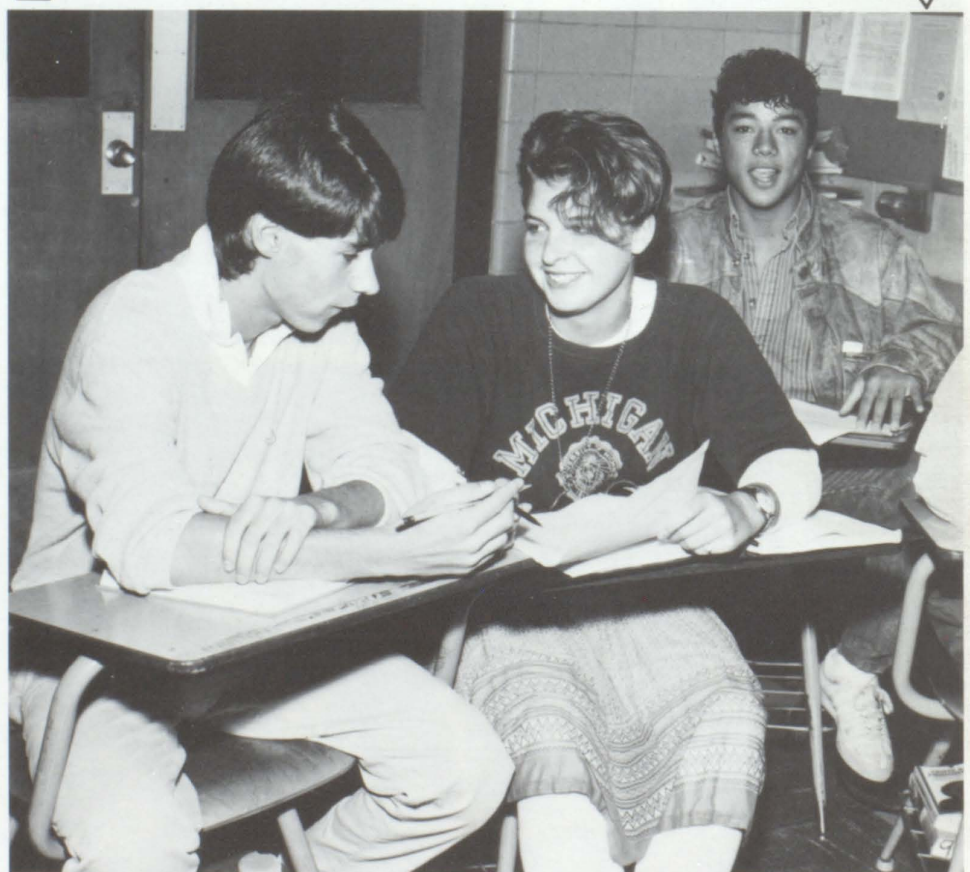

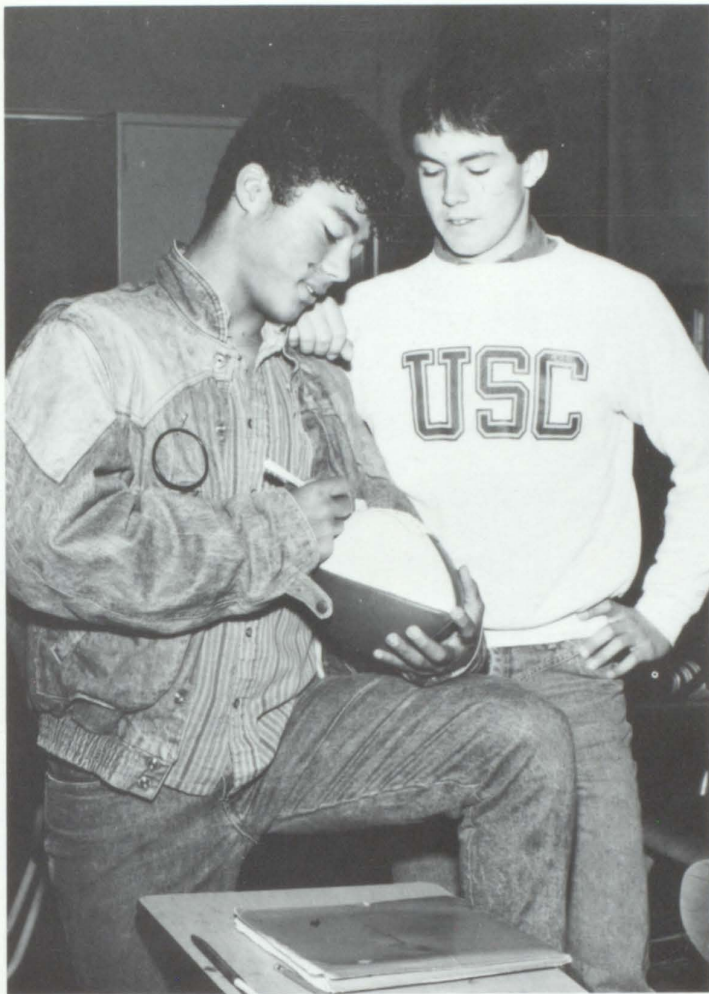




Roundtable
