GUIDE FOR RENTERS



Noise

- Be considerate and respect your neighbors' right to peace and quiet, especially after 10:00 p.m.
- Ordinance Section 278-35 prohibits disorderly conduct and disturbing the peace. Violations could lead to jail time and/or a fine.

Garbage Pickup

- Don't leave garbage in public view except in proper containers.
- The city's trash collection schedule can be found at romi.gov/trash. Put your garbage out no sooner than the evening before.
- Bring emptied bins back as soon as possible after pickup. Don't leave them at the curb for more than 24 hours.

Events & Occupancy

- Large events like family reunions, weddings, or parties can cause parking and noise issues.
- Check your vacation home's policies about events and day guests.
- Violating these rules could lead to the cancellation of your rental and charges for breaking city ordinances.

Parking

- Street parking can be limited. Use your vacation home's driveway or garage if possible.
- If street parking is available, try not block sidewalks, mailboxes, or driveways.
- Ask your property owner/manager about alternative overnight parking lots if needed.

Pets (If Allowed)

- Pets must be on leashes in unenclosed areas or public spaces.
- Pick up and dispose of your dog's waste.
- Don't let your pets trespass on neighboring property.
- Pets shouldn't make loud or frequent noise that disturbs the neighborhood.
